

# Stormwater Treatment Area 1 East CATCH AND RELEASE FISHING

Stormwater Treatment Area 1 East naturally removes phosphorus from urban and agricultural runoff flowing into the Everglades. Plants in the Stormwater Treatment Area are used for their ability to take up phosphorus, reducing to very low levels the amount of nutrients reaching the Everglades.

Large varieties of fish, birds and reptiles thrive in the managed marsh. Conserving the fish and wildlife encourages a healthy ecosystem and allows many people to enjoy this natural area.

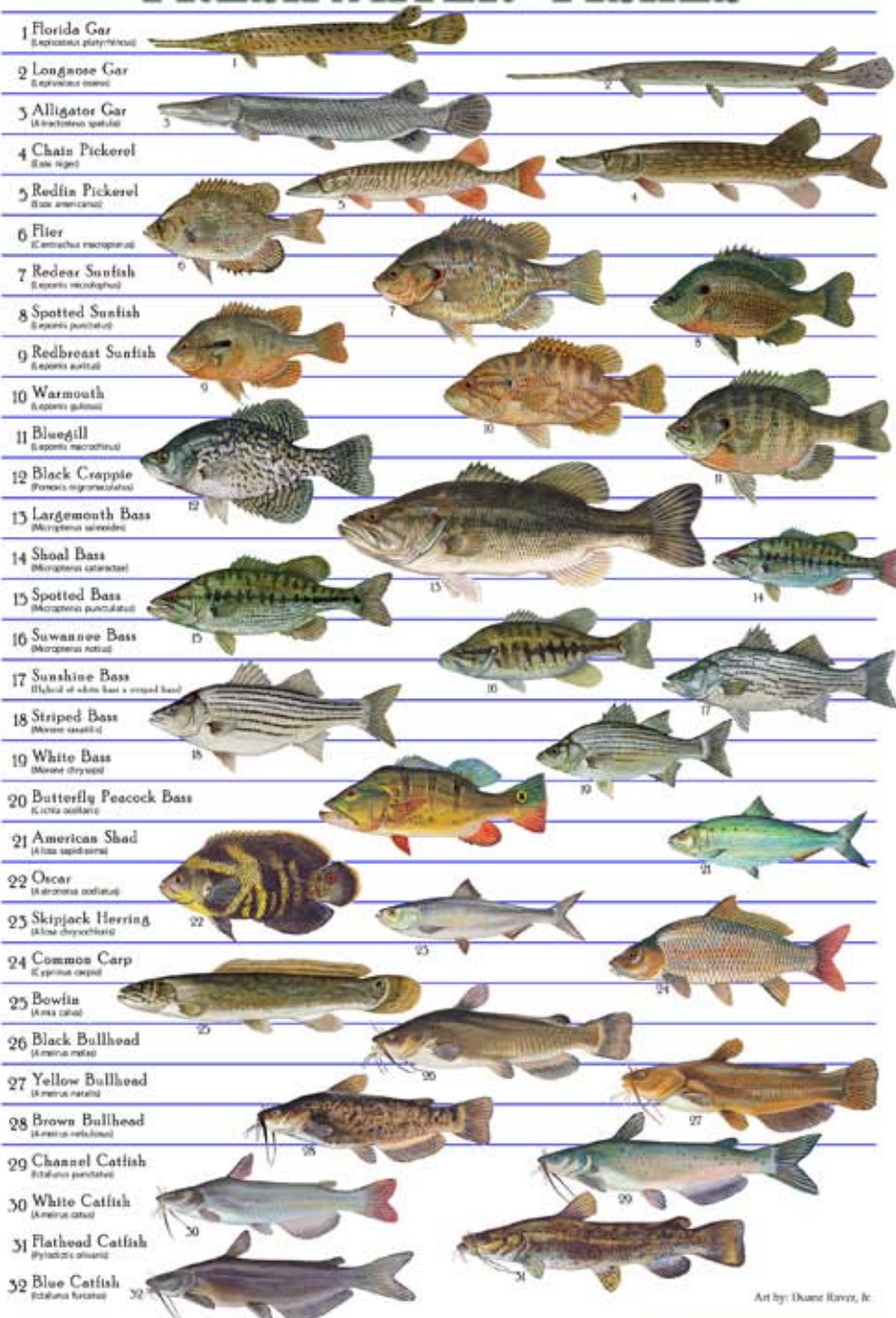
