Stormwater Treatment Area 1 West Expansion

Part of Restoration Strategies





PROJECT PURPOSE: The expansion of Stormwater Treatment Area 1 West (STA-1 W) is part of the state of Florida's \$880 million Restoration Strategies Program, which includes the design and construction of regional water storage, treatment and conveyance improvement projects to enhance water quality in America's Everglades. Located immediately northwest of the Arthur R. Marshall Loxahatchee National Wildlife Refuge (also known as Water Conservation Area 1), STA-1 W removes phosphorus and other nutrients from stormwater flowing into the Refuge and other parts of the greater Everglades.

Project Benefits

- Doubles the treatment area of the existing STA-1 W with an additional 6,500 acres built in two phases and further reduces phosphorus concentrations
