


Why do Rulemaking?

Florida Statutes Require:


- Revisions to Chapter 40E-61, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.) for the Lake Okeechobee Watershed
- New rules for the St. Lucie and Caloosahatchee River Watersheds

Northern Everglades Legislative History

- > 1987 373.4595 Florida Statutes (F.S.) Originally enacted as the Surface Water Improvement and Management (SWIM) Act
- > 2000 SWIM Act revised to become the Lake Okeechobee Protection Act (LOPA)
- > 2005 LOPA amended, including expanded boundaries for Lake Okeechobee Watershed; Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) statute (403.067 F.S.) amended to include statewide Basin Management Action Plans (BMAP) by FDEP
- 2007 LOPA became the Northern Everglades and Estuaries Protection Program (NEEPP); Further expanded to include the St. Lucie and Caloosahatchee River Watersheds
- 2012 FDEP adopts Caloosahatchee River Watershed BMAP
- 2013 FDEP adopts St. Lucie River Watershed BMAP
- 2014 FDEP adopts Lake Okeechobee Watershed BMAP
- 2016 NEEPP amended: BMAPs are the "watershed phosphorus control component for Lake Okeechobee" and the "pollutant control program" for the estuaries; directs SFWMD to revise 40E-61
- 2020 Section 85 of HB 5003 May affect 40E-61 amendments




Northern Everglades Statutory Direction


2016 Northern Everglades and Estuaries Protection Program (NEEPP) directs SFWMD to:

- Amend existing rules for Lake Okeechobee Watershed
- Develop new rules for Caloosahatchee and St. Lucie River Watersheds
- Provide for a monitoring program for non-point source dischargers required to monitor
- Develop and update Watershed Protection Plans
 - Nutrient Reduction and Storage Projects and Programs
 - Research and Water Quality Monitoring Program

Round One Workshops Input on Draft Concepts

Concept components:

- Monitoring
 - Watershed Monitoring Networks
 - Individual Monitoring Requirements
- Assessing Watershed Data
 - Evaluate data to characterize pollutant sources
 - Recommend and expedite tailored nutrient reduction activities
- Triggering Action where needed
 - Enhanced Source Controls
 - New or enhanced projects



Part I: Watershed Monitoring Networks

- Objective: Describe processes for collecting and assessing data to identify activities to improve the quality, quantity, timing, and distribution of surface water in the Northern Everglades watersheds
- District-collected data to represent
 - Nutrient concentrations
 - Flow
 - Different scales
- Other sources of data be
 - Collected with same QA/QC procedures
 - Parameters and frequency needed



Part I: Comprehensive Assessment of Targeted Areas

- Evaluate water quality data
- Characterize pollutant sources at different scales and their relative contributions
- Evaluate completed projects, effectiveness of rule-adopted BMPs, and nutrient reduction technologies
- Consider water management practices
- Identify gaps and research necessary
- Identify areas that need more targeted resources and evaluation

Part I: Assessment Findings

The District will identify areas where the following may be needed:

- Enhancements to existing projects
- New projects
- Enhanced source controls
- Reevaluation of BMPs



Part I: Reporting and Accountability

- > Annually
 - Publish assessment findings
 - Public meeting to engage stakeholders and discuss progress
 - Update webpage
- > As Needed
 - Coordinating Agency Public meetings





Part II: Individual Monitoring Requirements

- Objective: To provide for a monitoring program for those not implementing BMPs. The program will require landowners to:
- > Apply for permit to implement an approved monitoring plan
- Report monitoring data
- Take action if state water quality standards are not achieved, including implementing the appropriate BMP program
