




A snail kite forages in the littoral zone of Lake Kissimmee.

A large flock of white ibis and other wading birds take flight in the Phase I restoration area.









A flock of 50 roseate spoonbill (mostly immature) was observed in the Phase I Kissimmee River Restoration area. Both adult (yellow head/darker pink) and immature (white head/lighter pink) are seen here.

In the flock, one of the adult spoonbill was tagged. It was banded in Tampa sometime in the last five years. The South Florida Water Management District is gathering more information of when and where exactly it was banded.






