SUBJECT: Monthly Financial Statement Big Cypress Basin – May 31, 2026

This report provides an overview of the District's unaudited financial activity for Fiscal Year 2025-2026, including revenue collections, expenditures and encumbrances made against the \$37.0 million current budget, including a \$14.8 million encumbrance carryforward from Fiscal Year 2024-2025. The encumbrances represent orders for goods and services which have not yet been received. Attached is a summary in the State Program format in compliance with Section 373.536(4)(e), Florida Statutes, which states that each District shall provide a monthly financial statement in the form and manner prescribed by the Department of Financial Services to the District's Governing Board and make such monthly financial statement available for public access on its website.

Summary of Revenue Sources - New operating revenues collected (excluding prior year reserves) total \$21.5 million. Including reserves, the total Fiscal Year 2025-2026 revenue sources collected were 111.7% of budget or \$41.3 million.

- Taxes collected in the amount of \$15.3 million or 98.5% were distributed to the District through the Collier County Tax Collector at the end of May. Compared to the five-year average of 98.9%, receipts are 0.4% lower than trend at this time in the fiscal year. The total amount the District levied in Collier County was \$16.1 million and was discounted to \$15.5 million for budgeting purposes.
- Intergovernmental revenues of \$5.6 million were recognized. Of the revenue collected as of this statement, \$5.2 million is from the yearly payment for the Collier County Agreement for the Gordon and Palm River Structure Replacements and \$351,898 is from the US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) which represents OMR&R reimbursement for the Picayune Strand Restoration project for expenditures for quarters one and two. This reimbursement represents a portion of the \$1.4 million in budgeted intergovernmental revenues, based on quarterly USACE reimbursements equal to 50% of anticipated Picayune Strand expenditures.
- Interest on Invested Funds is recorded at \$465,272 as of the end of May. This amount includes \$177,184 earned on funds received from the Collier County Agreement for the Gordon and Palm River Structure Replacements.
- Licenses, permits and fees of \$5,875 were collected as of May.
- Other revenues of \$202,934 were received for the service center lease, field station scrap metal, and cash discounts.

Summary of Expenditure and Encumbrance - Big Cypress Basin has spent **\$12.4 million** and has encumbered **\$11.1 million** of the current budget. The Basin has obligated (encumbrances plus expenditures) **\$23.5 million** of the current budget.

- **Water Resources Planning and Monitoring Program** includes all water management planning, including water supply planning, development of minimum flows and levels, and other water resources planning; research, data collection, analysis, and monitoring; and technical assistance (including local and regional plan and program review). Mainly regional water quality projects, and modeling and monitoring support. Of the \$3.7 million budgeted for this program, Big Cypress Basin has obligated \$2.2 million: \$1.3 million expended and \$0.9 million encumbered.
- **Land Acquisition, Restoration and Public Works Program** includes the development and construction of all restoration capital projects, including water resource development projects / water supply development assistance, water control projects, and support and administrative facilities construction; cooperative projects; land acquisition; and the restoration of lands and water bodies. No funds are currently budgeted or expended in this program.
- **Operation and Maintenance of Lands and Works Program** include all operation and maintenance of facilities, flood control and water supply structures, lands, and other works authorized by Chapter 373, Florida Statutes. Particularly CREW land management, BCB capital projects, field station operations of flood control and Picayune Strand, and emergency reserves. Of the \$32.9 million budgeted for this program, the Basin has obligated \$20.9 million: \$10.7 million expended and \$10.2 million encumbered.
- **Regulation Program** includes water use permitting, water well construction permitting, water well contractor licensing, environmental resource and surface water management permitting, permit administration and enforcement, and any delegated regulatory program. No funds are currently budgeted or expended in this program.
- **Outreach Program** includes Basin staff support for all environmental education activities, such as water conservation campaigns and water resource education; public information activities; activities relating to local, regional, state, and federal governmental affairs. Of the \$40,219 budgeted for this program, the Basin has obligated \$10,051 which has been expended.
- **District Management and Administration** include all Basin Board support, service center, executive support; management information systems, unrestricted reserves; and general counsel, ombudsman, human resources, budget, finance, audit, risk management, and administrative services. Additionally, this program includes property appraisers, tax collectors & self-insurance fees in support of district and basin activities. Of the \$376,200 budgeted for this program, the Basin has obligated \$375,891 which has been expended.
