

## DuPuis Management Area Camping

There is no fee for camping in DuPuis. Camping is primitive — no electrical or water hookups. Campsites are filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Campground hosts are on-site year-round.

A Special Use License is required to camp at the DuPuis Family Campground, the DuPuis Equestrian Campground and the DuPuis Group Campground. Special Use Licenses can be obtained from the South Florida Water Management District online at [www.sfwmd.gov/sul](http://www.sfwmd.gov/sul). **Family Campground** - The Family Campground is accessed by entering DuPuis through Gate 1 on Jim Lake Grade. The Family Campground is approximately 1 mile down on the left side of the road. There are 16 campsites available, and each campsite has a picnic table and a fire ring. Potable water is available, and two composting toilets are located at the campground. Tents or pop-up campers are all that are allowed. No RVs, travel trailers, camper vans, etc. Generators are not permitted at this campsite.

**Group Campground** - The entrance to the Group Campground is located on DuPuis Grade. The site is less than a mile past the Cypress Boardwalk parking area before you reach the fishing pier. The Group Campground is for groups of 15 people or more. Please note that there are two reservations available per day for the Group Campground. If your group desires exclusive use of this site, both Special Use Licenses will be needed. Tents or pop-up campers are only allowed. No RVs, travel trailers, camper vans, etc. Generators are not permitted at this campsite.

**Equestrian Campground** - The DuPuis Equestrian Campground is located at Gate 3 on Kanner Highway (S.R. 76). All types of camping units are permitted, including tents and recreational vehicles. Generator use is permitted except from 11 p.m. until 7 a.m. Facilities include a bath house with hot showers, full flush toilets, dump station and potable water, 30 horse stalls and 15 horse paddocks.

**Primitive Campsites** - All are accessible via the Dupuis Loop hiking trails. The hiking trailhead entrance is located at Gate 2 on Kanner Highway (S.R. 76). There are three primitive campsites located along the hiking trail. The first is located on the east side of loop two; the second is at the south end of loop four; the third is approximately 1/4 mile north of the Ocean to Lake trail entrance to the Corbett Trail at the south end of DuPuis.
