## SFWMD Extends Burn Ban on Public Lands Open for Recreation

Campfires and other open burning are prohibited because of extremely dry conditions

**West Palm Beach, FL** — Due to severe drought conditions that have increased wildfire danger, the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) has issued an emergency order adding Orange, Osceola and Polk counties to the ban on building fires on certain District lands open for recreation. All of the District's 16 counties are now under this burn ban.

The burn ban, which applies specifically to land managed by the District, means no fires in grills, fireplaces or fire rings until further notice. The cautious use of portable camp stoves and grills for cooking purposes is allowed.



As of June 27, a total of 3,795 wildfires have burned 199,860 acres in Florida, according to the Florida Division of Forestry. The danger of additional wildfires persists.

Along with the burn ban, the SFWMD is asking residents and businesses to conserve water and follow landscape irrigation restrictions to stretch and protect the public water supply. For water saving tips, visit <a href="https://www.savewaterfl.com">www.savewaterfl.com</a>.
