Ready for 'Freddy'? SFWMD Prepares with Mock Hurricane *Media is encouraged to attend storm simulation modeled after Hurricane Frances*

WHAT: The South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) will test its hurricane readiness with the annual "Hurricane Freddy" exercise.

Trained District staff will participate in emergency management and flood control procedures in response to a simulated Category 2 hurricane. The virtual storm will follow a path similar to Hurricane Frances in 2004.

The full activation of the SFWMD Emergency Operations Center will offer a preview of operations for the 2011 hurricane season.

The exercise provides an opportunity to test and validate the agency's emergency response to a major hurricane to ensure operational readiness in advance of an actual storm.
