Higher Lake Levels Require Revised Navigation Lock Hours

WHAT: In response to rising Lake Okeechobee levels, the South Florida Water

Management District (SFWMD) will begin nightly closures of the navigation lock at S-310 in Clewiston. **Starting tonight**, the lock will be

closed to boat traffic from 9 p.m. to 5:30 a.m.

In addition, the lock will be staffed by a lock tender from 5:30 a.m. to 9 p.m. seven days a week. Boaters will be required to "lock through" to navigate between Lake Okeechobee and the Clewiston Canal and boat

basin.

Boaters can continue to access Lake Okeechobee at local boat ramps

during overnight hours.

WHY: The lock operational adjustment is necessary to ensure the flood control

system is operating as designed when water levels are higher.

WHERE: S-310 navigation lock on the south shore of Lake Okeechobee in

Clewiston, FL
