SFWMD Conducting Burn to Benefit Loxahatchee River Ecosystem Smoke from the prescribed burn will likely be visible to drivers and residents

WHAT:

Weather conditions permitting, the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) plans to conduct a 360-acre prescribed burn Wednesday to reduce wildfire danger and benefit the ecology on land bordering the Loxahatchee River in Martin and Palm Beach counties. Residents in nearby communities and drivers on Interstate 95 and Florida's Turnpike will likely see smoke from the managed burn.

The District is coordinating with local officials and the Florida Highway Patrol.

WHY:

Prescribed fire benefits include:

- Reducing wildfire danger
- Controlling exotic vegetation
- Improving wildlife habitat and plant diversity
- Maintaining fire-dependent plant communities
