SFWMD Plans Lake Kissimmee Navigation Lock Maintenance Service for smaller recreational craft to continue

WHAT: The South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) navigation lock at the S-65 flood control structure, located at the south end of Lake Kissimmee at State Road 60, will be partially shut down for maintenance work beginning Monday, April 14. Routine maintenance on the mechanisms that open and close the gates will help ensure the structure operates as designed for many years to come.

Because only one set of lock gates will be affected at any one time, smaller craft, less than 15-feet wide, will continue to lock through from the Kissimmee River to Lake Kissimmee and vice versa.
