Public Conservation Lands Scare Up a Spooky Halloween Event *DuPuis Management Area at the Martin/Palm Beach county line offers creepy crafts, hayrides and not-too-frightening family fun*

WHAT: Come in costume to the DuPuis Management Area for ghostly family fun under the stars and in the wild at the annual Haunted Halloween Celebration – if you dare. The popular event at the site, managed by the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD), features:

- Fun kids games and crafts
- Trick-Or-Treat Trail
- Hair-raising haunted house for ages 10 and older
- All-ages howling hayride through the woods

A \$10 fee per vehicle will go to support the Florida Center for Environmental Studies at DuPuis.

The DuPuis Management Area is a 22,000-acre natural area open to public recreation throughout the year. The area was part of the historic Everglades and features an ecologically diverse and significant vegetative community.

Throughout South Florida, the District provides recreational access to its public lands while continuing to manage them to support flood control, environmental restoration, water supply and water quality missions. At present, the District owns approximately 621,000 acres of land that are open to the public. Many of these properties are in their natural state or have enhancements such as picnic tables, informational kiosks, primitive campsites and hiking trails.
