SFWMD Adds Navigation Lock Information to Website

West Palm Beach, FL - The South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) has added <u>navigation lock</u> information popular with the outdoor community to the agency's website.

The Kissimmee Chain of Lakes, Kissimmee River and Lake Okeechobee offer some of the best boating and fishing opportunities in Central and South Florida. Navigation locks throughout this interconnected system ensure that it is accessible by the public for recreation. Along the route, there are 12 locks maintained by the South Florida Water Management District and five maintained by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.
