Heavy rains, caused by Hermine, in Kissimmee Valley increase flows on Kissimmee River

WHAT: As a result of recent rains in the Kissimmee River Valley, flows and

levels along the river have been increasing. Water levels are

expected to rise to approximately 28.8 feet in Pool D by Tuesday of

next week.

WHEN: September 8-13, 2016

WHERE: The S-65D Structure is located just south of the U.S. Highway 98

crossover bridge at the border of Highlands and Okeechobee County. Communities affected will be River Acres in Okeechobee

County and Hidden Acres and Kissimmee River Shores in

Highlands County.
