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SFWMD Plans Prescribed Burns to Benefit Kissimmee Ecology

Fire is an important land management tool


Orlando, FL — The South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) has planned prescribed burns on 6,000 acres throughout the Kissimmee Chain of Lakes Management Area (KCOL) from January through August to benefit the environment.

Dry vegetation combined with cooler weather and lower humidity during the winter and spring months create an opportunity to use fire to benefit habitats difficult to burn during other times of the year. Dates of the burns are variable because they are subject to weather conditions and other factors.

The objective of prescribed burning in the KCOL is to control woody shrub encroachment in prairies, marshes, mixed grasslands and pine flatwoods. The work will provide widespread ecological benefits for wildlife in the approximately 38,600 acres across Polk and Osceola counties.

Prescribed fire benefits also include:

- Reducing wildfire danger
- Controlling exotic vegetation
- Improving wildlife habitat and plant diversity
- Maintaining fire-dependent plant communities

Open flames and dense smoke will be present in parts of the management area during the burns. The public is asked to remain aware of their surroundings and watch for prescribed burning operations. Burn managers will coordinate with local governments and municipalities as burns are scheduled.
