Canal to Close Temporarily for Maintenance C-40 canal dredging to help improve flood protection

Okeechobee, FL — Okeechobee Field Station staff at the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) will begin a maintenance project next week to restore the C-40 canal to its original dimensions during a four-month dredging project. During the work, public access to the canal from State Road 70 south to the S-75 structure will be closed.

The canal is scheduled to reopen to boat traffic in November.

Work was necessitated from years of silt and sediment reducing the canal's ability to move stormwater runoff. The first phase of the project will restore the conveyance capacity of the canal by removing about 142,000 cubic yards of sediment, enough to fill more than 8,000 dump trucks.

The multiyear effort will ultimately remove more than 760,000 cubic yards of material from the C-40 canal between State Road 70 and the S-72 structure, just north of Lake Okeechobee.
