Regional Environmental/Water Supply Partnership Project

- Governing Board October 13, 2010 presentation on the Broward County Water Resources Task Force Report
- Proposed C-51 reservoir project was ranked #1
- Board noted potential benefits to Everglades restoration efforts
- Board directed staff to take the lead in developing consensus for this major regional water supply project



Project Concept

- Capture surface water currently being discharged to the Lake Worth Lagoon from C-51
- Potentially a long term and reliable source of water to meet environmental restoration needs of the Everglades
- Potentially a long term and reliable source of water to meet public water supply and other water demands
- Limit damaging impacts of discharges to Lake Worth Lagoon
