

Canal 18 Restoration-Revegetation Program

Department of Transportation Mitigation North Bank

In May 1989, an environmental administrator from the Department of Transportation inquired about using a portion of Canal 18 as a mitigation area. Detailed engineering design, opportunities for public input and permitting followed. DOT started project construction in January 1991. They completed the \$100,000 project in January 1992. The project added more than two acres of new saltwater wetlands, more than twenty-eight hundred linear feet of restored Limestone Creek, a small area of preserved/partially restored freshwater marsh and revegetated upland area. The total project revegetated over 1,500 linear feet of Canal 18 right-of-way. FDOT removed an extensive area of exotic vegetation as part of this project. District staff assisted Jupiter Landings in formulating a maintenance plan for the Right-of-way adjacent to their development, part of the DOT mitigation area. Jupiter Landings homeowners are implementing this plan.
