

Canal 18 Restoration-Revegetation Program

River Oaks

In March 1989, some residents of River Oaks development expressed their support of the revegetation plan on the right-of-way adjacent to their homes. In 1990, they requested permission to move ahead and obtain the necessary permits to allow implementing the project. Subsequently, they funded engineering design and obtaining environmental permits. In 1992 Loxahatchee Landings and River Oaks combined forces to perform restoration next to their developments at the same time. The District allocated funds, (received from others for the use of C-18 Right of Way) to provide partial cost-sharing to the Associations. Preserve Area west of River Oaks The project included a part of the right of way just west of River Oaks. While the area is designated as a preserve area, the contractor achieved some environmental enhancement by removal of exotic plant materials. The work left existing native plant material and included installing supplemental native plants.
