#### **STA5 Bird-Watching Tours**

Tours are limited to 60 participants. Participants must register in advance to reserve a space on the trips. Tours meet at the STA5 gate at 8:30am. To sign up for the STA5 Birding Tours, send an email to sta5birding@embarqmail.com with your name and contact information including an emergency cell phone number for the tour day, the date you want to go, and the number in your party. You may also leave a message at (863) 674-0695 or (863) 517-0202. Please plan on carpooling during the tour in order to limit the number of cars driving on the STA5 levee. Bring water, snacks and lunch. Walkie-talkies are suggested. STA5 is 20 miles from the nearest gas station. Donations are accepted by Hendry-Glades Audubon in order to defray expenses to provide this program. Park at the far right at the gate and levee. Follow one way traffic pattern.

STA5 consists primarily of four shallow-water cells, each one mile wide, two miles long, and six inches to 2 feet deep. The cells provide expansive stretches of open water interspersed with mudflats and aquatic vegetation. Eighteen miles of levee roads surround the cells, providing exceptional viewing opportunities.
